

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
OF THE LAWRENCE CITY COUNCIL

DATE: Tuesday, February 17, 2009

A **REGULAR MEETING** of the City Council was held on **Tuesday, February 17, 2009** at 7: 03 p.m. in the City Council Chamber with all Members present. Councilor Silva arrived at 7:09 p.m.

Approximately Twenty-five [25] persons were present.

A Moment of Silence was held.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

I. ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES: - None

II. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Council President Blanchette requested those who wished to provide public input and participation to present them-selves and address the City Council. Upon the invitation of Council President Blanchette, the following individuals addressed the City Council:

Paula Breen, 219 South Broadway, Lawrence, MA spoke in opposition to the proposed sale of the Saunders School for use as a residence for low income people.

Doreen Fritschy, 59 Chester Street, Lawrence, MA suggested the item pertaining to the sale of the Saunders School remain tabled to allow for further discussion between the neighborhood residents and the developer.

Ellie Curtin, 189 Elm Street, Lawrence, MA stated she got another parking ticket and objects to being unable to park near her home without being cited. She suggested that Council approve resident sticker parking be instituted for Brunswick House.

H. Maali, 53 Chester Street, Lawrence, MA suggested that many residents near the Saunders School were unaware of the proposed sale and development plan of the Saunders

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School building and recommended that the information be publicized to reach more people in the neighborhood.

Eileen Breen Grenda, 219 South Broadway, Lawrence, MA spoke in opposition to the proposed sale and development of the Saunders School building citing various problems related to use density that exists and will be exacerbated.

Matthew Ogden, 76 Summer Street, Lawrence, MA spoke on behalf of the LaRouche Action Committee regarding the “Homeowners and Bank Protection Act” and urged the Council Members to adopt and approve the proposed resolution form submitted.

Hazel Belanger, 152 Chester Street, Lawrence, MA commented on the congestion and traffic around the Saunders School area and stated she opposed the sale and development of the Saunders School.

Joseph D’Amico, 11 Lorenzo Road, Lawrence, MA asked the Council Members to remain after Council Meetings to discuss issues with those who may remain. He also urged the public to attend City Council and Sub-committee meetings.

Francis Cialek, 260 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA suggested the City Of Lawrence sell the Lawrence Airport to obtain money to help lower taxes.

Mark Gray, 17 Groton Street, Lawrence, MA stated he never received information requested concerning the amount of available housing in the City of Lawrence and the revenue produced by housing to further consider the proposed Saunders School project. He suggested that a reasonable decision cannot be made without obtaining and reviewing housing information about the area.

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John Menihane, 95 Chester Street, Lawrence, MA suggested that all property in the City of Lawrence should be owner occupied to assure responsible homeowners are present and available. He stated that providing an owner-occupancy component to the Saunders School project would be beneficial.

Annette Taylor, a business owner at 249 South Broadway, Lawrence, MA spoke in opposition to the proposed Saunders School Project. She discussed the existing congestion and how the area already suffers from too many people and traffic in the area.

Upon the conclusion of the public comment portion of the Council Meeting, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez offered a motion to take document 33/2009 out of the order appearing on the agenda. The motion was seconded by Councilor Moran and unanimously approved by the Council Members present [9-0].

III. APPROPRIATIONS-ORDERS-RESOLUTION:

Council President Blanchette brought the measure to the attention of the Council Members and presented a Proclamation honoring the St. Patrick’s Day Parade Committee for their efforts organizing the 2009 St. Patrick’s Day Parade.

Marie Gosselin thanked the City Council Members for their interest and support this and every year the celebration is presented to the Lawrence residents. She provided some of the anticipated highlights of the St. Patrick’s Day Parade and informed everyone that it will take place on Sunday, March 8th, 2009.

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Upon conclusion of the proclamation, Councilor Kolofoles offered a motion to take document 25/2009 out of the order appearing on the agenda. The motion was seconded by Councilor Silva and unanimously approved by the Council Members present [9-0].

IV. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

At the request of Council President Blanchette, Councilor Kolofoles presented the report from the Ordinance Committee in the form of a motion to approve the St. Patrick's Day Parade for March 8, 2009. The motion was seconded by Councilor Abdo and unanimously [9-0] approved by the Council Members present.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez offered comments about the need for affordable housing for Lawrence residents and discussed how the proposed Saunders School Project will help meet that necessity.

V. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

At the request of Council President Blanchette, the City Clerk read the public hearing notice regarding the above as published. Upon the conclusion of the Clerk's reading of the public notice, Council President Blanchette opened the public hearing portion of the proceedings and invited anyone who wished to be heard to present themselves before the Council Members.

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Upon no discussion or comment offered by anyone present, Council President Blanchette closed the public comment portion of the proceedings and called upon the Council Members present to offer comment or discussion.

Upon no discussion or comment offered by the Council Members present, Council President Blanchette closed the discussion portion of the hearing and called upon the Members present to consider the matter presented. Upon a motion to approve the measure presented by Councilor Moran, as seconded by Councilor Kolofoles, the Council Members present voted unanimously [9-0] to approve the measure.

A further motion presented by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez to waive the 30 days waiting period required by section 3.8(a) of The Lawrence City Charter was duly seconded by Councilor Moran and unanimously approved by the Council Members Present [9-0].

At the request of Council President Blanchette, the City Clerk read the public hearing notice regarding the above as published. Upon the conclusion of the Clerk’s reading of the public notice, Council President Blanchette opened the public hearing portion of the proceedings and invited anyone who wished to be heard to present themselves before the Council Members.

Ogden Jones [no address location provided] spoke in favor of the proposed ordinance.

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Elias [last name unknown], 28 Chandler Street, Lawrence, MA informed the Council Members of the parking difficulties that occur on Chandler Street and generally spoke in favor of the proposed item.

Upon no further public comment offered on the matter, Council President Blanchette closed the public hearing portion of the proceedings and called upon the Council Members present to offer comment or discussion.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofoles presented a motion to approve the item and to waive the 30 days waiting period required by section 3.8(a) of The Lawrence City Charter, which was seconded by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofoles commented and discussed the parking difficulties on Chandler Street.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez spoke in favor of the item presented.

Upon no further discussion or comment offered by the Council Members present, Council President Blanchette closed the discussion portion of the hearing and called upon the Members present to consider the matter presented.

Upon a motion to approve the measure and waive the 30 day waiting period required by section 3.8(a) of The Lawrence City Charter presented by Councilor Kolofoles as seconded by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez, the Council Members present voted unanimously [9-0] to amend the current “No Parking” restrictions to include Chandler Street in the list of streets that allow alternate side parking pursuant to Ordinance 10.36.031.

At the request of Council President Blanchette, the City Clerk read the public hearing notice regarding the above as published. Upon the conclusion of the Clerk's reading of the public notice, Council President Blanchette opened the public hearing portion of the proceedings and invited anyone who wished to be heard to present themselves before the Council Members. Upon no public comment offered on the matter, Council President Blanchette closed the public hearing portion of the proceedings and called upon the Council Members present to offer comment or discussion.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofoles presented a motion to approve the item which was seconded by Councilor Twomey.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Twomey stated no one was present to advocate approval from National Grid.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez presented a motion to table the item which was seconded by Councilor Twomey and unanimously approved by the Council Members present [9-0].

VI: COMMUNICATIONS FROM MAYOR, CITY OFFICIALS & CITY ATTORNEY:

Doc. 39/09: Water Commissioner – lay off- Compliance with MGL Chapter 111 Section 160 – City Attorney invited to attend - Council Pres. Blanchette – Tabled

Council President Blanchette introduced the item and discussed the reasons for presenting the item. Council President Blanchette invited Assistant City Attorney Richard D'Agostino to address the City Council.

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Attorney D'Agostino generally discussed the necessity of maintaining a water commissioner as required by the Department of Environment Protection. Attorney D'Agostino informed the Council Members that the position requires a grade 4 license and that three employees have been approved as primary operators of the Water Department by DPW Director Frank McCann. Attorney D'Agostino stated that DEP has been notified of the City's approval of a primary operator.

Council President Blanchette stated that he had requested the City Attorney to provide a legal opinion on the issues pertaining to the removal of Water Commissioner Robert Fazio. Attorney D'Agostino responded by stating that Commissioner Fazio's "lay-off" of is not permanent but a temporary measure. Council President Blanchette again requested a written legal opinion be provided.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofoles posed inquiries to Assistant City Attorney D'Agostino about the reasons for laying off Commissioner Fazio.

Council President Blanchette informed Councilor Kolofoles that these matters should be reserved for executive session of the City Council and should be pursued after a written legal opinion is submitted. Attorney D'Agostino informed the Council Members that the issue may require certain union involvement.

Council President Blanchette stated that the City Council Members were concerned for the general state of Public Safety without a Water Commissioner in place and stated concerns that the Council Members were not provided notice of "lay-offs" prior to their occurrence. He stated that the first notice the Council Members received was from the recent new articles appearing in the newspaper. A discussion ensued between Attorney D'Agostino

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and Council President Blanchette concerning the City Charter provisions regarding “Department Heads”.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez stated her concern about not receiving prior notice of Commissioner Fazio’s lay-off in order to assure proper representation of constituents. She also suggested that a special meeting be scheduled for purpose of discussing this matter and other lay-offs.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofoles posed questions to Attorney D’Agostino about applicable laws that may relate to the duties and responsibilities of a Water Commissioner. Attorney D’Agostino suggested that G.L. c. 111 section 160 is applicable and concerns the requirements of municipal employment of a Water Commissioner.

Attorney D’Agostino emphasized that “lay-off” in this situation is not a disciplinary action.

Council President Blanchette again insisted that the City Attorney’s Office provide a written legal opinion to the Council Members and the matter be subject to further Council meetings as necessary.

Further discussion between Councilor Kolofoles and Attorney D’Agostino ensued regarding the statutory requirement of employing a Water Commissioner.

Upon no further comment, discussion or inquiry, Councilor Kolofoles presented a motion to table the item which was seconded by Councilor Twomey and the Council Members present voted unanimously [9-0] to table the matter.

Upon no further comment, discussion or inquiry, Council President Blanchette referred the item to the Budget and Finance Committee for clarification.
