

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING**  
**OF THE LAWRENCE CITY COUNCIL**

**DATE: Tuesday, May 5, 2009**

A **REGULAR MEETING** of the City Council was held on **Tuesday, May 5, 2009** at 7: 08 p.m. in the City Council Chamber. The following Council Members were present at roll call: Council President Blanchette, Council Vice President Kolofoles, Councilor Fielding, Councilor Moran, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez, Councilor Twomey, and Councilor Silva. Councilor Gonzalez arrived at 7:10 p.m. Councilor Abdo was absent from the meeting.

Approximately thirty [30] persons were present.

A Moment of Silence was held.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**I. ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:**

Council President Blanchette informed the Council Members present that the minutes of City Council Meetings conducted March 3, 2009 were submitted by the City Clerk for consideration and acceptance of the City Council Members.

Upon the motion of Councilor Fielding to accept the minutes as presented duly seconded by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez, the Council Members present voted unanimously [7-0] to accept the minutes.

**II. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:**

Council President Blanchette requested those who wished to provide public input and participation to present themselves and address the City Council. Upon the invitation of Council President Blanchette, the following individuals addressed the City Council:

Homayoun Maali, 53 Chester Street, Lawrence, MA spoke of the disarray of the Lawrence School Department.

Mark Gray, 17 Groton Street, Lawrence, MA spoke in opposition of the politicization of education in Lawrence.

Dave Mazzaglia, appeared on behalf of workers for the Department of Public Works and discussed recent layoffs of DPW employees and the financial impact it is having on the public.

Tom Sapienza, 14 Young Ave., Lawrence, MA discussed recent DPW employee layoffs and the impact it has on the public.

Ike Gabriel, Local 3-SEIU representative, discussed the recent DPW employee layoffs.

Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez presented a motion to take document 147/2009 out of the order appearing on the agenda. The motion was duly seconded and unanimously approved by the Council Members present [8-0].

Upon no discussion or comment offered by anyone present, Council President Blanchette closed the public comment portion of the proceedings and called upon the Council Members present to offer comment or discussion.

A brief discussion ensued between Councilor Kolofoles and Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez regarding the hours of the loading zone [3:30 – 5:00 p.m.].

Upon no further discussion or comment offered by the Council Members present, Council President Blanchette closed the discussion portion of the hearing and called upon the Members present to consider the matter presented. Upon a motion to approve the measure presented by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez, as seconded by Councilor Kolofoles, the Council Members present voted unanimously [8-0] to approve the measure.

A further motion presented by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez to waive the 30 days waiting period required by section 3.8(a) of The Lawrence City Charter was duly seconded and unanimously approved by the Council Members Present [8-0].

Council President Blanchette read the City Ordinance regarding the requirements for a resume and application. He also stated the recommendation was presented on April 27, 2009 and posting closed on April 28, 2009.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Silva suggested the item be withdrawn.

Discussion ensued between Councilor Silva and Council President Blanchette regarding the matter. Councilor Silva presented a motion to withdraw the item, the motion dies for lack of a second.

Discussion ensued between Councilor Twomey and Council President Blanchette regarding the usual referral of items for appointment without a resume and application.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofos suggested the resume and application may not be necessary at this time.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Silva suggested that all recommendations should have a complete package.

Upon being granted the floor Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez posed questions about the length of service by Mr. Schiavone as Acting Director in relation to the approval process. She suggested that it appears to be a position that is offered but not available in general. Discussion ensued among Council Members regarding the submission of other applications by interested person.

Upon no further discussion or comment, Council President Blanchette referred the item to the Personnel Committee.

Budget and Finance Director Mark Andrews introduced the item.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Silva asked Director Andrews if there was a reason that the Mayor was not present to submit the FY 2010 Budget. Director Andrews stated that he was not sure why the Mayor was not present.

Director Andrews completed presentation of the FY 2010 Budget.

Council President Blanchette informed the Council Members that the FY 2010 Budget was received together with the FY 2010 School Department Budget. Council President Blanchette posed specific questions regarding the difference between the itemized information contained in the FY 2009 Budget amounts reported and the proposed FY 2010 Budget documents which do not appear in the same format.

Director Andrews responded to questions posed by Council President Blanchette concerning the proposed FY 2010 Budget.

Council President Blanchette asked if all stipends were removed from the proposed budget. Director Andrews stated they were not. [A discussion ensued about the proposed forty day furlough submitted as part of the FY 2010 Budget and the proposed 1,100,000.00 tax increase being proposed].

Council President Blanchette informed Director Andrews that much more information is necessary to even consider the proposed FY 2010 Budget. He stated that he believes the Mayor's proposed budget is not realistic considering the recent DPW layoffs and the resulting poor condition of the public parks in the City.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Silva asked if the proposed budget document would be available on-line. Director Andrews stated budget copies will be publicly available through the Office of the City Clerk, The Library, and on-line.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Twomey asked if the 45 days period runs from April 30, 2009 or May 5, 2009. Council President Blanchette stated it runs from May 5, 2009 [the date the Budget Document was received].

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez posed questions to Director Andrews regarding the proposed budget with specific inquiry about the proposed forty day furlough. A discussion ensued between Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez and Council President Blanchette regarding the proposed forty day furlough plan as part of the FY 2010 Budget.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Silva commented on the budget process and stated that time lines are required.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez commented on the difficult challenge presented by the proposed FY 2010 Budget figures.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Twomey posed questions to Director Andrews about revenue source stream for FY 2010 Budget. Councilor Twomey asked questions about discussions with Police Unions, Fire Unions and other unions regarding the possibility that they will reach an agreement with the City. Director Andrews declined to comment on the prospect of reaching an agreement with the various unions at this time and suggested the City Attorney should be contacted concerning the status of union negotiations.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Moran posed questions about the prospect of FY 2010 staffing. Councilor Moran suggested that “across the board” cuts in each department of the City may be necessary. A discussion ensued between Councilor Moran and Council President Blanchette regarding the method of implementing budget cuts that

may be necessary. Councilor Moran commented on the observable and direct impact the current financial situation is having on the City of Lawrence.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofoles stated that the format provided in the FY 2010 Budget documents is not as user friendly as documents submitted in prior years. He stated that the loss of DPW personnel resulting from recent layoffs is causing equipment to remain in disrepair and damages to be permanent. Councilor Kolofoles expressed his displeasure with the proposed FY 2010 Budget. He also posed questions about Federal and State stimulus funds that should be made available through the CDBG funds.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Silva posed questions about the Parking Commission as appearing in the proposed FY 2010 Budget.

Council President Blanchette discussed the furloughs proposed as part of the FY 2010 Budget and the possibility that layoffs will still occur resulting in the financial obligation to pay unemployment benefits. He cited the recent layoff of DPW employees which appear to have cost more than it would have to retain the employees on payroll.

Upon no further discussion, comment or inquiry Council President Blanchette referred the matter to the Budget and Finance Committee.
