

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
OF THE LAWRENCE CITY COUNCIL

DATE: Tuesday, July 18, 2006

A REGULAR MEETING of the City Council was held on **Tuesday, July 18, 2006** at 7:14 p.m. in the City Council Chamber with all Members present. Council President Blanchette presided over the meeting.

Approximately Twenty-one [21] people were present.

A Moment of Silence was held.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

I. ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:

Council President Blanchette informed the Council Members present that the minutes of City Council Meeting held on June 6, 2006 were submitted by the City Clerk for consideration and acceptance of the City Council Members.

Upon the motion to approve the Minutes of the City Council Meeting of June 6, 2006 presented by Councilor Parolisi and seconded by Councilor Silva, the Council Members present voted unanimously [9-0] to approve the minutes submitted.

II. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Council President Blanchette requested those who wished to present public input and comment to present themselves and address the City Council.

Frank Cialek, 260 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA, spoke of his duties and responsibilities as a worker for the City Department of Public Works [DPW]. He asked for volunteers to assist in cleaning the Campagnone Common after events held there to show their dedication to the City of Lawrence.

Ellie Curtin, 198 Essex Street, Lawrence, MA, took issue with the Eagle Tribune news articles regarding City workers alleged to be stealing newspapers. She also spoke of an FBI probe into a school custodian.

Byron Perrotta, 77 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA, spoke of the trucks that damaged and removed the wires from the street poles at 12-14 Temple Street. He asked if the City Council would have signs installed so that no trucks would be permitted to drive in that area.

Lori Cavanaugh, 12 Temple Street, Lawrence, MA, spoke of the damaged wires caused by trucks taking wires down on Temple Street on July 12th. She stated that she was afraid that her daughter and granddaughter would be killed by the electric wires that were loose in the street.

Katrina Ramos, 77 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA, stated that it was dangerous to allow trucks to travel down Temple Street and that they needed to be regulated.

Reverend James Stokes, Boxford Street, Lawrence, MA, stated that he also believes that trucks traveling down Temple Street are dangerous and should not be allowed. He stated that the Lawrence Police failed to report the dangers resulting from the wires after the truck took them down from the street pole and that he believes that this presents a serious public safety issue.

Upon no other individuals requesting to offer public comment, Council President Blanchette closed this portion of the proceedings.

IV. COMMUNICATIONS FROM MAYOR, CITY OFFICIALS AND CITY ATTORNEY:

Council President Blanchette informed the Council Members that this matter was before the City Council for the first time and that he is referring it to the Ordinance Committee for further proceedings.

**213/06 National Emergency Grant – Award to City of Lawrence – Flood Disaster –
Mayor Sullivan – Matter Presented**

Council President Blanchette requested Planning Director Sweeney to present the matter before the Council Members present and granted the floor to Director Sweeney.

Director Sweeney announced the award of a National Emergency Grant to the City of Lawrence and stated that the funds would be used to hire approximately 21 people to complete repairs to damages caused by the recent flooding. He stated that additional funds would be allocated to hire rehabilitation specialists through the Inspectional Services Office. He discussed grants provided to Mary Immaculate inpatient residential facility to assist in funding necessary repairs to that building as well as repairs to Lazarus House.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez asked Director Sweeney if there were fund available to pay people for wages or income lost during the flood.

Director Sweeney stated that he would look into the matter and obtain the information as soon as possible. Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez asked Director Sweeney to describe the duties and work performed by those who were hired to assist in the flood related matters. Director Sweeney stated that he had written information available and would provide the

handouts of that information to the City Council Members and anyone else who may be interested.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Gonzalez discussed the implementation of the relief and assistance efforts with Director Sweeney. Director Sweeney explained that his address before the City Council on this matter was only informational and no action was necessary by the Council Members in regard to the acceptance of the funds provided through the grant.

Upon being recognized, Councilor DiMarca stated that he was surprised to learn that legal residents of the United States were not allowed to apply for assistance which he believes was discriminatory.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Kolofos asked Director Sweeney how long the employees hired would remain in the positions assigned – Director Sweeney responded by stating the length of each position held would depend upon the work being done. A discussion between Councilor Kolofos and Director Sweeney ensued concerning the possibility that the positions hired through the grant might become permanently assigned municipal position.

Upon no further comment, discussion, or inquiry on this matter, the presentment of Director Sweeney was accepted by the Council Members present.

Council President Blanchette opened the proceedings on the matter with reservations concerning whether or not the matter was properly before the City Council and asked Community Development Director Ezra Glenn to explain the petition to the Council Members present with particular emphasis on the disparity between the funds requested and the Consolidated Plan Application.

As requested, Director Glenn informed the Council Members present that it may be possible that some block grant funds may be unused and that the petition application may represent a preference for a public process regarding Community Development Block Grant funding [CDBG]. Director Glenn then discussed the the block grant funding application

process. He stated that he would like to meet with the applicant to discuss the matter in greater detail.

After Director Glenn's explanation was completed, Council President Blanchette referred the matter to the Budget and Finance Committee for further proceedings.

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

**Doc. 128/06: Acting Job Positions & Consultants for more than 90 days –
Ord. Comm-Tabled**

Upon being recognized, Councilor Kolofoles read the report of the Ordinance Committee not to recommend any change to the current City Ordinance regarding this matter. Councilor Kolofoles presented the report in the form of a motion to approve and adopt the report of the Ordinance Committee which was seconded by Councilor Gosselin.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez stated that she needed more information on the matter before she could decide whether to approve the report provided.

Upon being recognized, Councilor Silva explained that she had concerns about the many "Acting" appointments in the City offices that have been in existence for more than 90 days. She commented that there was not much the City Council could really do about the matter and suggested that resulted in the lack of any recommendation from the members of the Ordinance Committee through its proceedings.

Councilor Frechette suggested that the full Council should consider directing the Personnel Department to provide a complete list of all employees that are in "acting" positions and working more than 90 days.

Council President Blanchette informed the Council Members that the “90 day ordinance” was drafted through his efforts as a past member of the City Council in 2002 and there were some ex-post factor issues raised.

Councilor Frechette stated that information concerning the number of employees in “acting” positions was necessary prior to any further proceedings on the matter.

Upon being granted the floor, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez stated that she believes that some employees were eligible for health insurance benefits if they were employed in an “acting” capacity for more than 90 days.

Councilor Kolofoles stated that he agreed with Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez and asked about the definition of a “provisional appointment”. He stated that the perception is that the City Council has no authority over provisional appointments.

Councilor Silva stated that it is her understanding that the City Council could amend the ordinance or delete it entirely.

Council President Blanchette explained that the 90 day “cap” was intended to avoid skirting the public nature of the positions affected and other requirements.

Upon no further discussion or comment on the matter, Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez presented a motion to “table” the measure which was seconded by Councilor DiMarca and unanimously approved by the Council Members present [9-0].

Councilor Frechette requested that the Personnel Director be sent a request to provide the City Councilors with a complete list of all Temporary Acting positions with the name of the employee, the date of hire, and the number of hours per week. The suggestion was

Council President Blanchette introduced the item as an additional item placed on the agenda and requested Councilor Kolofoles to present the report of the Ordinance Committee.

Councilor Kolofoles presented the report of the Ordinance Committee and moved that the prior agreement concerning State Highway Commission supervision over parking be accepted and that any prior ordinance concerning parking be reinstated. The motion was seconded by Councilor Gosselin.

Councilor Kolofoles explained that the reason for presenting the report was to amend the agreement between the City of Lawrence and the Massachusetts Highway agreement concerning parking provisions along Broadway that had been instituted due to reconstruction of the roadway.

Councilor Frechette stated that he was not sure about the impact of the Ordinance Committee report and was not clear exactly what was being requested by the motion presented.

Councilor Kolofoles suggested that all that was necessary that City Council accept the report submitted and amend the ordinance.

Councilor Frechette commented that there was no ordinance presented for approval by the Ordinance Committee by the report cited and that the issue concerning approval of an ordinance was not properly before the City Council Members.

Councilor Parolisi suggested that it may be more appropriate to present a motion to reinstate the original parking ordinances that may have been in place prior to the construction project. A discussion among the Council Members ensued about prior ordinances and their current application, if any.

Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez stated that the issue regarding the ordinances that may be reinstated needs to be clarified and that ordinances concerning parking on Haverhill Street may need to be amended. She suggested that a favorable vote on the motion presented may be appropriate and that future amendments may have to be presented to address particular parking issues in that area.

Council President Blanchette stated that the lack of an existing agreement with Massachusetts Highway would reinstate any prior ordinances that may have existed but for the agreement to suspend such ordinances and that amendments would be necessary to address any changes in the area resulting from the construction.

Councilor Frechette read the latest agreement in place with Massachusetts Highway into the record and asked Assistant Engineer Andrew Wall to explain the impact of the terms of the most recent agreement. Assistant Engineer Wall explained that the representatives of The Massachusetts Highway Commission have agreed to amend its prior agreement to address the new construction configuration in the area and the requirements of the area businesses in regard to parking issues that have arisen. Mr. Wall suggested that the terms

would amend the existing agreement and that City Council approval may not be necessary. He also stated that passing additional or amended ordinances may, in fact, violate the terms of the agreement that is currently in place.

Councilor Silva stated that recinding the entire agreement and later proceeding with Amendments to applicable City Ordinance provision concerning any parking restriction in that area would be appropriate.

Councilor Frechette asked that the Chair call the matter to a vote and stated that if the measure was properly addressed at prior meetings then there would be no difficulty at this time. He further commented that the recommendation of the City Engineer should be considered particularly due to the new conditions that the new construction has brought to the Broadway and Haverhill part of the roadway.

Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez commented that her interest in this matter rests with the businesses along Broadway that have been disrupted by the construction and clarified that the City Council has been limited in its ability to take representative action due to the agreement between the City of Lawrence and The Massachusetts Highway Commission.

Councilor Kolofoles read from a letter from The Massachusetts Highway Commission dated May 22, 2006 into the record of the City Council.

Councilor Frechette objected to Councilor Kolofole's reading of a letter into the record that had not been provided to the other Council Members.

Upon no further comment or discussion on the matter, Council President Blanchette called motion presented to the attention of the Council Members present who voted
