

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
OF THE LAWRENCE CITY COUNCIL

DATE: Tuesday, August 15, 2006

A REGULAR MEETING of the City Council was held on **Tuesday, August 15, 2006** at 7:06 p.m. in the City Council Chamber with all Members present. Council President Blanchette presided over the meeting.

Approximately Twenty-five [25] people were present.

A Moment of Silence was held.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

I. ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES: None.

II. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Council President Blanchette requested those who wished to present public input and comment to present themselves and address the City Council.

Katrina Ramos, 77 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA informed the Council Members that large trucks were still traveling down Temple Street. She also took exception to being called a liar by Councilor Gosselin.

After Ms. Ramos was finished speaking, Councilor Gosselin denied calling Ms. Ramos a liar at any time.

Bryan Perotta, 77 South Union Street, Lawrence, MA stated that Councilor Gosselin accused him of lying about his residence at 77 South Union Street.

Reverend James Stokes, 103 Boxford Street, Lawrence, MA stated that traffic lights should be installed at the five corners location in South Lawrence as a necessary safety measure. He also commented about the wires being struck by trucks on Temple Street and

complained that Lawrence Police Chief Romero failed have his officers properly respond to a report of the incident.

Sarah Dubik-Unrich, 21 Woodland Street, Lawrence, MA spoke about a recent report in the Valley Patriot newspaper and commented that it inaccurately portrayed Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez as being opposed to handicapped housing initiatives.

Anna Luna, 599 Canal Street, Lawrence, MA discussed the proposed abandonment of Marion Avenue and County Road in Lawrence and stated that it would be better to retain them as public roads.

Louise Beland, 426 Riverside Drive, Lawrence, MA spoke about how one of the Lawrence Zoning Board Members fell asleep during one of the hearings. She stated that she was embarrassed and upset about the incident and implored the Council Members to investigate the matter.

Kate Gormley, Acting Director of Groundworks, Lawrence, 60 Island Street, Lawrence, MA spoke about the new park being completed on Brook Street and believed it should be named after Dr. Nina Scarito.

Jackie Morales, 15 Bodwell Street, Lawrence, MA spoke in support of Nilka Alvarez-Rodriguez citing examples of assistance to disabled persons in the Community. She also criticized the Valley Patriot newspaper article as negative journalism.

Tennis Lilly, 40 Spruce Street, Lawrence, MA, Lawrence, Conservation Commission Chairman, spoke in support of keeping Marion Avenue as a benefit to flood mitigation efforts in the flood plain near Daisy Street and the Spicket River.

Keith Jones, 22 Kent Street, Somerville, MA expressed his disgust and indignation at the exploitation of handicapped people exhibited by the Valley Patriot newspaper using people with disabilities for political gain.

Andre LaRoux, Lawrence Community Works, One Highlawn Avenue, [City unstated], thanked Kate Gormley and the Council Members for their efforts completing the new Brook Street Park.

III. APPROPRIATIONS-ORDERS-RESOLUTIONS:

Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez requested that she be permitted to present a Resolution under document number 256/2006 of the City Council out of the order appearing on the Council Agenda as a motion which was seconded by Councilor Kolofoles and unanimously approved [9-0] by the Council Members present.

Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez presented the Resolution of Council to Pavel M. Payano and informed the Council Members present that Mr. Payano is the past president of the Lawrence Teen City Council and remains active in student government while in attendance at the University of Massachusetts/Amherst. She informed the Council Members that Mr. Payano was a member of several student body boards at U-Mass. and presently serves as the Lawrence Democratic Party City Committee.

Council President Blanchette, Councilor Frechette, and Councilor Gosselin praised Mr. Payano for his civic accomplishments, academic achievement, and efforts.

Mr. Payano thanked the Council Members for their recognition and for the opportunity to serve on the Teen City Council. He stated that his academic goals and

achievements were to someday be able to serve in a meaningful capacity in shaping the future of government in Lawrence.

Upon no discussion on the matter presented by any of the Council Members present, Councilor Kolofoles presented a motion to approve the item presented which was seconded by Councilor Parolisi. Councilor Gosselin offered a brief explanation to Councilor Kolofoles concerning the location of the resident parking area to be implemented by the ordinance upon approval. Upon no further comment or discussion regarding this item, the Council Members voted unanimously [9-0] to approve the measure.

At the request of Council President Blanchette, the City Clerk read the notice of public hearing into the record. Upon completion, Council President Blanchette invited anyone who wished to speak upon the measure.

Melissa Morasse [no address provided] spoke in favor of the measure presented and urged the Council Members to approve the item. She asked if it were possible that the handicapped parking space that is put into place could be reserved solely for her use.

Reverend James Stokes informed the Council Members present that the Sunbridge Nursing Home causes all the available handicapped parking spaces to be taken and that is the reason that the residents are requesting that the space be reserved solely for their use if possible.

Councilor Kolofoles stated that he didn't believe that it was possible to reserve a specific handicapped parking space location for a particular person or assigned to a particular residence.

Ms. Morasse stated that unless sole and exclusive use by her and the residents of her home was possible that she didn't have any use for it.

Councilor Gosselin stated that she would like to sponsor an ordinance that will allow assigning particular handicapped parking spaces to particular individuals on the street sign installed. She suggested that the handicapped placard that is placed in the windshield could then be matched to the name appearing on the handicapped sign marking the parking location.

Council President informed the Council Members that the handicapped placards do not disclose the names of the individual they are issued to and are "confidential".

Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez suggested that an additional handicapped parking space may be necessary under the circumstances.

Upon no further comment or discussion presented on the matter, Councilor Kolofoles presented a motion to approve the measure which was seconded by Councilor Parolisi and unanimously approved [9-0] by the Council Members present. Councilor Kolofoles also moved to have the matter approved as an emergency measure in order to waive any applicable 30 day period that may apply which was seconded by Councilor Alvarez-Rodriguez and unanimously approved [9-0] by the Council Members present.
