E-billing



Planning and Development



The end of June and first part of July saw three new parks added to the City of Lawrence.



On June 28th, the Mayor and the State delegation we were joined by Matthew Beaton, Secretary of the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs, to open up 3.3 acres of land at the confluence of the North Canal, and the Spicket and Merrimack Rivers on a property known as "the Ferrous Site." This park, where bald eagles are seen along the river in winter, will provide passive recreation, picnicking, and exploration in a scenic "urban wild" setting. The

local nonprofit environmental organization, Groundwork Lawrence, received a grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Signature Urban Parks Initiative to buy the property and build the park on behalf of the City. Groundwork transferred title to the property to the City on the week of the ribbon cutting. On July 15th, everyone had a fun and wet time at the grand opening of the Spray Park at the Point (operates Monday-Friday 8:00am-9:00pm, Saturday and Sunday 8:00am-10:00pm) at the intersection of East Haverhill Street and Newbury Street in the North Common Neighborhood. It was perfect timing as that day ushered in a heat wave that has persisted over the past several weeks, and the Point has taken on a beach vibe as children cool off and parents and older siblings watch from blankets and chairs on the shady hillside. The Point is the former location of the St. Lawrence O'Toole Catholic Church, which was demolished in the 1980's. Special thanks go to Groundwork Lawrence and Lawrence Community Works which organized the community input and planning for this park. Lastly, we joined 200 young people at a soccer clinic at the brand new John P. Kane Park, at Osgood and East Cambridge Street in South Lawrence – to celebrate the completion and opening of the City's newest park which includes a new, irrigated, regulation size soccer field on natural turf, as well as a walking path, a new playground, and adult exercise equipment. Each of these parks was funded with Grants from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs. The City's CDBG program provided matching funds for the Spray Park and the Kane Park, and the City used Chapter 90 funds to replace deteriorated sidewalks along the East Haverhill side of the Spray Park. These three park additions provide 7 additional acres of recreation land to the City. Special thanks go to our hardworking state delegation who continue to support park improvement programs in the legislative and appropriations process on Beacon Hill.

Illegal Dumping Bill Made Into Law

The five year old legislative proposal to address illegal dumping in Lawrence was made into law, placing greater fines and possible criminal penalties for the most egregious illegal dumping violators. The new fines can range upwards to \$10,000. "This bill will hold people accountable and ensure that we have an enhanced quality of life for our residents and I am proud to have supported it," said Mayor Daniel Rivera, who was a member of the City Council in 2011. "I want to thank our State Delegation for working so hard to get this bill passed and particularly Rep. Marcos Devers for getting the ball rolling for us on the state level." An important component to the proposal is the creation of a dedicated account where the fines collected can only be spent on illegal dumping related matters.

Mayors Health Task Force/CHNA 11

The MHTF was busy throughout the summer with initiatives ranging from Mass in Motion to the third annual Lawrence Ciclovía. Here are some of the highlights:

Lawrence Mass in Motion (MiM)



Lawrence has entered its third year as a Mass in Motion community under the Mass. Dept. of Public Health. As part of this statewide network which seeks to improve health and wellness of its residents, through physical activity and healthy eating, Lawrence MiM has been working tirelessly with the Office of Planning and Development, the Department of Public Works, and the Lawrence Police Department, on the Complete Streets Initiative, as well as Parks and Open Spaces. As a result of this work, a Complete Streets Ordinance has been passed and projects have been filed with the MA DOT. Work is also underway to institute a Park/Open Space Stewardship program, through the Department of Public Works. Our Healthy on The Block/Bodegas Saludables (HoTB) Project is also gaining traction and our subcontractor, Groundwork Lawrence, has been working to get the currently participating bodegas up and running as fully fledged HoTB participants. Essex Market and El Mello are two noteworthy mentions of this initiative.



Lawrence Ciclovía 2016

Lawrence Ciclovía 2016 was an even bigger success than previous years!

This year we welcomed more people, saw more bikes and more helmets being used, and people of varying abilities and ages, join us for our annual Open Streets event. Children's tricycle races, and volleyball, basketball and soccer on the streets, were among the various activities offered at this event. Our many thanks to our long list of partners for making this event the success it was. Special thanks to Betsy Goodrich from the Merrimack Valley Planning Commission, who with Vilma Martinez-Dominguez, MHTF Coordinator, co-chaired the planning committee for the second consecutive year. The MHTF also thanks those joining us for the first time UMass Lowell, who assisted with the evaluation component of Ciclovía, MassBike, who joined by MassDOT/Safe Routes to Schools and BiciCocina, educated participants on bike and pedestrian safety, Greater Lawrence Family Health Center, who gave away close to 100 helmets, courtesy of Lawrence General Hospital, and the Office of Planning & Development, which hosted a Healthy Streets booth, showcasing the many construction and infrastructural projects in our streets, parks and open spaces currently happening in our City. Special mention too to all the businesses along the route that opened and joined in the festivities, whether it was by offering refreshments, hosting games, or outreaching to the Ciclovía participants, thank you for your participation. Ciclovía could not have been the success it was without you.
