Detective McLellan consciously chose not to use deadly force and was able to apprehend the suspect without incident. Hundreds of thousands of children living in the United States have elevated blood lead levels that may cause significant damage to their health. They can develop behavior and learning problems such as: hyperactivity, slowed growth, hearing problems, and aggressive patterns of behavior. Stopping a child's exposure to lead from lead-based paint, house dust, or any other source is the best way to prevent the harmful effects of lead.

To raise awareness of the consequences of lead poisoning among parents and pregnant women who live in homes built before 1978, the City of Lawrence Lead Abatement Program is participating in Lead Poisoning Prevention Week, which is October 24th -29th 2016. The City of Lawrence joins the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in encouraging parents to learn more about how to prevent lead poisoning.

This year's Lead Poisoning Prevention theme is "Lead-Free Kids for a Healthy Future," as it underscores the importance of testing your home and testing your child. The City of Lawrence, in partnership with the Office of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) offers grants of up \$10,000 per unit to assist Lawrence residents with lead inspections and deleading with the purpose of creating healthy, lead safe environments for children to live in. 
Breast Cancer Awareness Month


